

At least she seems to know what to say to Theodore, Freddie's younger brother, who stutters badly and has no





AVIATOR'S GERTIFICATE

Time & Again Theatre Company was formed in the summer of 2017, by Laura Crow, as a new young theatre company wishing to explore all things vintage and historical in ways that are fresh and relevant for today.

Following on from success at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe, Time & Again have begun rural touring their work across the UK as well as bringing it to studio theatres, museums and heritage sites related to the historical aspect of their plays. They hope to continue to do this and build on it throughout the rest of 2019 and 2020.

Time & Again have featured in The List magazine as well as in their guide 'Best Shakespeare coming to the Edinburgh Festival Fringe 2018', in Northern Soul in an interview about mental health and the arts, and on the front page of the Macclesfield Express.

In July 2019, Time & Again won an Undrowning Scholarship of \$1000 as part of a scheme to help female-led shows. The award was given in recognition of Time & Again's effort to draw attention to the lack of women in STEM, particularly the gender imbalance in the aviation industry, with their show, Clouds.

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION

Run Time - Ihr (no interval)


Set Elements - I x Blackburn Monoplane scaled replica measuring approx. 3m long and 2.8m wingspan. Splits apart into 4 easily assembled parts for ease of travel and get in/get out of venues.

Minimum Staging Requirements - 4 metres by 4 metres with 1 entrance.

Lighting - Company can provide own lighting or venue to provide 3 states: house lights, general wash state, and take note dimmed.

Sound - Company can provide own sound or will need access to sound system with 3.5mm output jack.

Touring Company - 5 x performers, I x lighting & sound technician, I x stage manager.
